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# Profile of Florida's Public Workforce Education Program Providers by Service Area

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December 2010

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## Introduction

Florida's workforce education programs help individuals attain skills needed to become or remain economically self-sufficient. These programs provide training designed to meet local and state workforce needs and help Florida compete in the global economy by building a broadly based, highly skilled, and productive workforce.

Workforce education programs include both postsecondary career education and adult education programs. Postsecondary career education programs prepare individuals for specific occupations and award various credentials upon completion. In the 2008-09 school year, Florida's school districts and colleges served approximately 187,000 students. Adult general education programs provide literacy, basic skills, and English language training to help individuals improve their job performance and/or move to higher paying jobs. Districts and colleges served approximately 320,000 students in adult education programs in the 2008-09 school year.

School districts also provide career education programs for high school students that enable students to earn industry certifications and postsecondary credit. High school students may take career education courses to earn secondary credit, or they may participate in dual enrollment opportunities with a district technical center or college to earn postsecondary credit.

School districts and colleges have local authority to decide what workforce education programs to provide in their service areas and how to organize program delivery.<sup>1</sup> As a result, workforce education programs vary throughout the state, as does the division of responsibility between districts and colleges.

This report is a supplement to OPPAGA [Report No. 10-61](#), and profiles each college service area, detailing which entity (school district or college) provides workforce education programs and enrollment numbers for these programs during the 2008-09 school year. The report also includes a list of any programs that were duplicated by the college and district in the same county during that school year and a list of each entity's top five largest postsecondary career education programs.

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<sup>1</sup> Each of the 28 Florida College System institutions has a service area that includes one or more school districts, with all 67 districts covered by one of the 28 service areas.

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## Methodology

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We obtained 2008-09 enrollment data from the Department of Education. The department provided aggregate secondary career education enrollment numbers. Postsecondary career education students must have completed at least 1 instructional hour in the program, and adult education students must have completed at least 12 instructional hours in the program to be included in the profile enrollment tables.

To determine if colleges and school districts were duplicating workforce education programs, we analyzed 2008-09 institutional enrollment data for postsecondary career and adult education programs. If a specific program (i.e., Cosmetology vocational certificate) was being offered by both a college and a district within the same college service area, we contacted the institutions to determine if each was offering the program within the same county. We considered programs to be duplicated only if they were being offered by both a college and district within the same county.

## Summary Statistics

As shown in Exhibit 1, school districts provide most of the state's adult education (81%), adult vocational certificate (76%), and apprenticeship programs (72%). Colleges provide all degree and college credit programs and the remaining adult education, adult vocational certificate, and apprenticeship programs. A large number of high school students participate in career and technical programs for secondary credit (616,255), and some students dual enroll with a college or district technical center to earn postsecondary career education credit.

School districts and colleges tend to offer different types of workforce education programs rather than providing the same training programs within a county. Among the hundreds of workforce programs offered, there were few cases in which districts and colleges offered the same career education program within a county during the 2008-09 school year. There were eight counties in which a school district and a college offered the same career education program.<sup>2</sup> In total, we identified 40 duplicated programs across the state, ranging from 1 in Pasco County to 16 in Miami-Dade County.

Districts and colleges were more likely to duplicate adult education programs; we identified 18 counties in which both school districts and colleges offered the same adult education programs in the 2008-09 school year.<sup>3</sup>

The top five largest career education programs vary by system. As shown in Exhibit 2, the Nursing associate in science degree program (leading to a Registered Nurse credential) had the highest number of students enrolled in the college system during the 2008-09 school year, while the Practical Nursing vocational certificate program (leading to a Licensed Practical Nurse credential) had the highest enrollment in the districts.

## Florida College Service Area Profiles

The following profiles provide detailed information on the types of workforce education programs offered by school districts and Florida College System institutions, and the numbers of students enrolled in these programs during the 2008-09 school year.

The table below describes each type of workforce education program included in the profiles. Districts and colleges both provide workforce education programs, but only colleges are authorized to provide degree and college credit programs.<sup>4</sup>

Program Type	Program Description
<b>Secondary Career Education</b>	
Career and Technical Program – Secondary Credit	Career and technical courses taken at a high school for which students earn high school credit. A series of these courses may allow a student to earn an industry certification upon graduation.
Postsecondary Vocational (PSV) Certificate Dual Enrollment	Courses taken through a district technical center or college for which high school students earn postsecondary college credit toward a vocational certificate
Postsecondary Adult Vocational (PSAV) Certificate Dual Enrollment	Courses taken through a district technical center or college for which high school students earn postsecondary vocational credit toward a vocational certificate
<b>Postsecondary Career Education– Degree and College Credit</b>	
Associate in Science Degree	A two-year technical degree that prepares students for employment; some associate in science degrees are transferrable toward bachelor's degrees
Associate in Applied Science Degree	A two-year technical degree indicating that a student has trained in a particular field and is prepared for employment; the coursework is more applied than an associate in science degree, and the degree is not intended to transfer to a bachelor's degree program
College Credit Certificate (PSV Certificate)	A short-term college credit career education program that is part of an associate in science or associate in applied science degree, consisting of the technical courses required for these degrees but not the general education courses
<b>Postsecondary Career Education – Vocational Credit</b>	
Applied Technology Diploma	A short-term program that is part of an associate in science or associate in applied science degree that leads to employment in a specific occupation; may provide either vocational credit or college credit
Adult Vocational Certificate	A vocational credit program that trains students in technical skills that enable them to attain and sustain employment and realize economic self-sufficiency. Adult vocational certificate programs do not require students to have high school diplomas to enroll in the program, but students must attain a specified score on a basic skills exam to complete the certificate program.
Apprenticeship	A relatively long (up to five years), highly structured program that provides vocational skill training in a given job through a combination of on-the-job training and classroom instruction
<b>Adult Education</b>	
Adult Basic Education	Basic literacy and life skills training for adults who are performing below the ninth grade level in reading, mathematics, and language arts
Adult High School	Instruction that prepares adult students to successfully complete credits leading to a high school diploma. Coursework is at the high school grade level (9th through 12th grade levels).
Adult High School (Co-enrolled)	Instruction that provides high school students who lack the credits necessary to graduate with their high school cohort class with the opportunity to obtain those credits
General Educational Development	Instruction that prepares students to obtain the necessary skills required to pass the Official GED Test and be awarded a State of Florida High School Diploma; for students who are performing at the ninth grade level or above



As shown in Table 2, the Business Administration associate in science degree program had the highest number of students enrolled during the 2008-09 school year.






